

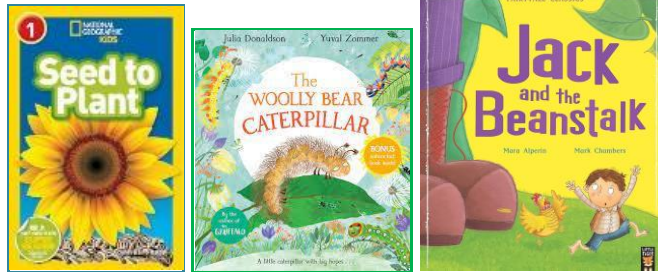
Moss Park Primary School Reception Summer 1



Topic: Plant and animal Life Cycles

Literacy

Our core texts for this half term are 'Seed to plant' (non - fiction) 'The Wooley Bear Caterpillar' and 'Jack and the Beanstalk.'



We will also be reading a variety of fiction and non- texts around life cycles. We will be writing simple sentences that include tricky words and diagraphs that we have learnt in phonics.

As storytellers we will sequence stories and retell them in the correct order.

Maths

In maths we will be exploring numbers **beyond 10**. The children will be encouraged to look closely at 'teen numbers' between 10-20. We will be building these numbers, looking at patterns and verbally counting past 20.



Then we will be asking the question '**how many now?**' We will be exploring addition and subtraction. We will be working out how many have been added and how many have been taken away using the number facts that we already know.

At the end of the half term we will thinking about how we can **manipulate**, **compose** and **decompose** shapes. We will be using shapes to make arrangements, copying, rotating and manipulating them.

Phonics

We will be revisiting and practicing these sounds and words:

ch sh th ng ai ee igh oa oo(long) oo(short) ar or ur ow (as in brown cow) oi

Tricky words:

they, we, are, you



We will be learning a new set of sounds and words:

ear air ure er

Tricky words:

all was give live

Handwriting

In our handwriting sessions we will be revisiting the formation of all of our letters within the following letter families:

Long legged giraffe letters

l i t u j y

One armed robot letters:

r b n h m k p

Curly caterpillar letters:

c a d o s g q e f

Zig-zag monster letters:

z v w x

We will be learning how to form these letters as **capital letters** as well as learning how to form the numbers **1-9**.

Home learning opportunities

- Share a story every day with your child and talk about what is happening.
- Label any creations at home with simple sentences.
- Listen and support your child when reading their phonics book every day.
- Practise the tricky words by playing pairs, snap or memory games.
- Display the sounds, phonics words and tricky words around your home.

- Find teen numbers in the environment and talk about how they composed.
- Add and subtract quantities at home e.g. with toys, food, natural objects outside.
- Practise subitising skills by asking questions like 'how many?' and 'how did you see it?'

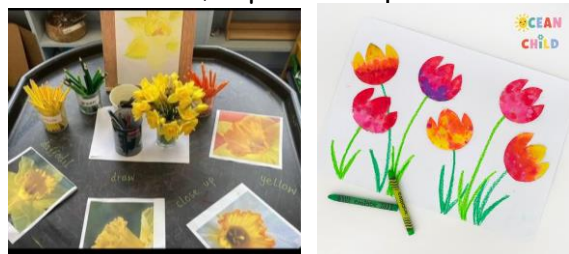


Topic: Plant and animal Life Cycles

Year Group: R

Expressive Arts and Design

As artists we will be using drawing tools with increasing precision and drawing with increasing complexity and detail. We will be linking our art work to nature, in particular plants and flowers.



Our weekly music lessons focus on 'Big Bear Funk' and we will be singing, listening and responding to different types of music and instruments. We will be using our stage area outside to perform familiar songs.

We will be using our small world areas to act out familiar stories like Jack and the Beanstalk. We will be inventing, adapting and recounting stories.

Personal, Social, Emotional Development

As part of our PSED will be thinking about 'Relationships', focusing on:

- Family
- Making friends
- Falling out
- Being the best friend we can be



We are continuing to talk about our school rules and routines and making sure we are Ready, Respectful and Safe. As well as, continuing to talk about our feelings in relation to the Colour Monster story.

Understanding the World

This half term will have a big focus on the natural world. We will be talking about the season of Spring and noticing plants and flowers growing and changing. We will discuss how the weather is changing as well as researching baby animals that might be born in spring time.



We will be observing closely and labelling parts of plants. We will have the opportunity to grow our own plants.



We will be talking about how animals including humans grow and change. We will focus on the life cycle of a butterfly and get to experience this first hand.

Home learning opportunities
