• Inspire, Create, Perform

This unit develops pupils' understanding of exploring, creating and performing movements and actions. Pupils will have the opportunity to develop their knowledge of simple actions and use of space, relationships and dynamics. They will have fun with different stimuli and experiment with simple choreographic approaches.

• Target, Control, Combine

This unit has an important focus upon pupil's hand eye and foot eye coordination skills linked to sending and receiving. Pupils can use different adaptations of these activities to focus on exploration and repetition of fundamentals techniques, applying them to cooperative and competitive games. Through lots of engagement with these key skills children will be able to try and develop some of their own coaching points leading to improved mastery of techniques and more successful outcomes.

Music - Wider Opportunities - Ukulele

This term will focus on introducing pupils to playing the ukulele as part of an ensemble. They will follow the ukulele course on Charanga, using specially designed materials to help them develop the technical skills needed to play their instruments confidently. Alongside this, they will also take part in group singing and rhythmic games to enhance their overall musicianship. The term will conclude with a concert where pupils will showcase what they have learnt.
