Topic: Transport and Under the Sea

Literacy

Our core texts for this half term are 'The Hundred Decker Bus' by Mike Smith and 'Somebody Swallowed Stanley' by Sarah Roberts/




We will also be reading a variety of fiction and non-texts around vehicles and sea life including looking after our oceans.

We will be writing sentences that include tricky words and diagraphs that we have learnt in phonics. E.g. This is a fish. It can swim fast. It has a long tail.

Maths

In maths we will be exploring sharing and grouping. We will be talking about what sharing is and start to share things equally and say when it is unequal or unfair. We will be investigating whether a number is odd or even by sharing them into two groups. We will be discussing doubles and halves.



During the second half of the half term our topic is visualise, build and map. We will be identifying repeating patterns and making our own pattern rules. We will be thinking about positions, directions and drawing our own maps.



Home learning opportunities

- Label any creations at home with simple sentences. E.g. My rocket has a booster.
- Listen and support your child when reading their phonics book every day.
- Practise the tricky words by playing pairs, snap or memory games.
- Display the sounds, phonics words and tricky words around your home for lots of recall opportunities.
- Talk about sharing in your daily routine using the language equal, unequal and fair.
- Recall doubles and halves of numbers to 20.
- Find out if an amount of objects in odd or even by sharing them into groups.

Phonics

We will be revisiting and practicing these sounds and words:

We will be learning a new set tricky words:

We will be applied all our previously learnt sounds to more complex words. E.g. crept, swift, bench, airport, funfair

As Geographers, we will be thinking about the seas and oceans on our planet. We will be talking about how we protect our oceans and look after the planet through stories and discussions.
