The journey begins in Year 3 with their very own sketchbook. Children will learn how to record, practise and develop their creativity in an effective way throughout their years at MPJS.



In Year 3, children will begin the year by researching and applying a variety of drawing and paint techniques through Andy Warhol and the Pop Art movement. In Spring, they will explore 3-D sculpture inspired by nature and by Summer they will dive full speed into Aboriginal Art; focusing on journey pieces.
