New Phonics and Spelling Rules

Spanish has some unique sounds of its own:

Nñ
The tilde 'ñ': *España, mañana*

LLl
'll' We hear this in: *Me llamo Arturo.*

In Spanish, the 'h' eg: in *hola* is silent

a 'A mayúscula' = capital A



We can hear the difference in some sounds:




New Grammar and Sentence Structures

Inverted punctuation marks: ¿.....? ¡.....!


Names start with a capital letter:

Masculine nouns use a determiner 'un' = 'a'
