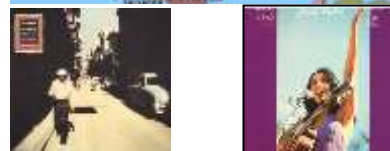

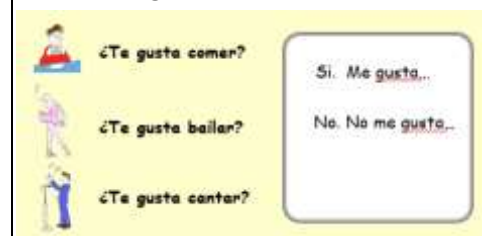
New Grammar Points

Me gusta + singular noun:



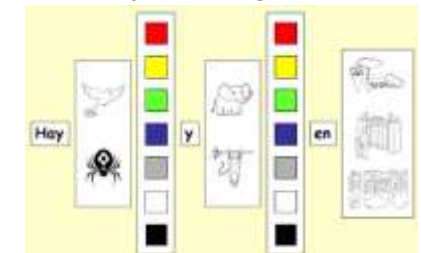
Me gusta + infinitive verb:
